

Major the Polar Bear Scholarship

About This Scholarship

The "Major, The Polar Bear Scholarship" is a \$1,000 award that is given annually with support from the Salem 5 Foundation in June to a deserving Massachusetts high school senior who will continue his/her education in an animal or environmental related field and has documented community service. The first scholarship was awarded in 2001 to a deserving student from Malden.

The scholarship originated as a tribute to Major, the beloved Polar Bear of the Stone Zoo who was passed away in June 2000 after a long bout with cancer. Major had been the star attraction since his arrival at the Stone Zoo in 1975. He weighed about 900 pounds stood over 8 feet tall and lived to be 33 years old – the oldest known polar bear in captivity. In addition to entertaining generations of families for more than 2 decades, Major was the "poster bear" that galvanized the community to successfully fight for the reopening of the Stone Zoo after its brief closure in the early 1990s.

Describe your planned course of study in college. What are your goals for after graduation? What will your first steps be to attain those goals? (1-2 paragraphs)

Part III

Everyone has assets and strengths, which are often visible through your accomplishments. Tell us about one of your proudest accomplishments. What personal strengths and skills did you use? (1-2 paragraphs)

Part IV

Every aspect of you, your situation, your history and experience can be used to your advantage in college and in your career. Tell us anything else we should know about you when reviewing your application. (1-2 paragraphs)

IV. Required Attachments

Please provide the following attachments:

- Proof of status as a graduating senior
- Proof of community service
- One reference from each of the following:
 - 1) Teacher or guidance counselor from the high school the applicant is graduating from
 - 2) Supervisor that oversaw the applicant's community service work, and
 - 3) Former employer

For each reference, list their name, title, email, phone and fax #, as well as mailing address.
